

## St. Sebastian Frostbite Award Scheme

The Frostbite Award Scheme is a recognition of an archer's ability shooting Frostbite rounds during the winter season (1<sup>st</sup> October to 31<sup>st</sup> March) and applies to all archers, irrespective of age or ability and is for recurve bow types.

- The Frostbite round is three dozen scored arrows shooting at 30m distance using an 80cm diameter target face and ten zone scoring.
- Awards are for scores in excess of 200, 225, 250, 275, 300, 315, 330, 340 and 355 (Maximum score is 360).
- 6 sighters to be followed by the Frostbite round.
- For seniors, a qualifying score needs to be achieved on two separate days to qualify for the attainment.
- If a senior achieves an award score and achieves a higher award score on a subsequent day, they can elect to either take the lower award or try and achieve the higher award score on another day. If they elect to take the lower award, the higher score cannot be used to later qualify for the higher award and the senior archer needs to achieve the higher award score twice more.
- Juniors (under 18 at the time the round is shot) need only submit one qualifying score to achieve the award.
- The score must be witnessed by a second senior (over 18) archer.
- Scores to be submitted (either using the Official Score sheet, or an archer's own score sheet) to the Records Officer or another club officer as soon as possible after achieving the score.
- Once an archer has claimed an award, subsequent awards must be for a higher award score.
- Successful archers may purchase a quiver badge of recognition of the relevant score at a cost of £2.50.
- When an archer achieves a higher score award, they can either purchase an additional quiver badge or they can "trade in" the lower award badge for the higher award badge (assuming the badge is undamaged) for 50p.
